Telehandler Training Courses Fort Mcmurray - Employers are responsible for ensuring that their operating personnel and supervisors are trained to work proficiently utilizing telehandler machines. The skill level of employees need to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that employees attain the required level of skill. The level of responsibility of the person must be taken into consideration when training is offered. Effective training will solve whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training could be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not deal with such subject matters as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, using different attachments, or the utilization of rotating machinery. Further training would have to be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work location.

Maintenance and Inspection

The telehandler requires routine maintenance like any other machinery. The equipment will wear out eventually, so correct maintenance is required to ensure the safe operation of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to rectify, monitor and prevent problems associated with deterioration, damage and wear. Staff need experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions should be viewed seriously and complied with, taking into consideration such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for making sure that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use inspections are usually performed by the user.
